The Speak Up, Epping! Recreation Group's goals include:

Completing a list of the recreational opportunities, both indoors and out, that Epping has to offer, and then finding a way of making this information available to the community.

As a result of the Recreation Group work, the sign for the Lamprey River Forest has been moved to the trailhead entrance and parking field on Prescott Road and the trails have been brushed out. Many thanks to the Society for the Protection of N.H. Forests for this work on their property.

We have tried out some downtown walking routes to note improvements needed for safety: sidewalks, marked crosswalks, rough patches on hardtop. (Note: This project is also part of the Downtown Revitalization Group).

The award was presented to Officer Seth at the Great Bay Heroes Breakfast for his quick action in administering CPR to a crash victim in February. Had it not been for his taking immediate control of the situation and for his quick thinking, the woman could have suffered serious brain injury or death as a result of a lack of oxygen.
