We are grateful for the opportunity to serve our community through our food pantry. The regular provision of the food pantry is a combined effort of the congregation of Epping Community Church and St. Joseph's Catholic Church of Epping. We are grateful to our brothers and sisters for making possible food items to help those who are going through difficult times. We are also grateful to the Explorers for sending food items from their food collection efforts at Wal-Mart this month. We are currently averaging over 150 individuals and families a month who are assisted through the Epping Community Church food pantry.

Beginning October 30, the Epping Community Church is sponsoring "Soup of the Day Café" from 11:00 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. every Thursday. Anyone who wishes, is invited to come and enjoy wonderful soup and a time of great company and conversation.

Another ministry of the church that may be active in November is our Telephone Caring Ministry. We will be receiving names and telephone numbers of elderly, sick and shut-ins, and others in and around our community who wish to be called daily between 8 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. just to have someone check to be sure they are up, about and okay. Volunteers and friends of ECC will call the individual signed up for this free service. If they do not answer, we will call their contact person so they may be followed up on. There will be no charge for this ministry. Know an elderly or shut in person who may benefit from this service? Ask if they would like to have us call them and then give us their information, contact person and telephone number.

The third Saturday of November will bring our Ham Dinner as the monthly meal. We invite you to bring your family and invite your friends to come and enjoy a great ham dinner for a donation of \$7.00. All funds raised will go to help one of our youth, Olivia Baker, fund her trip to Costa Rica next spring. We truly appreciate your help and support.

News from the Freshman Team...

In seminar we have finished reading the novel "Speak", which brought about some very insightful discussions. We are now officially starting our **silent reading program** where the students will be asked to read something of their choice on certain seminar days. Epping High School Instructional Corner

Teachers at Epping High are busy improving the quality of instruction in the classroom. All teachers at Epping High are involved in a program called The Framework for Effective Instruction. Teachers are busy assessing how successfully students can access textbook material, teaching students to use metacognitive thinking (ask your son or daughter what metacognition means and they will tell you), and writing lesson plans that connect goals to assessment using higher order thinking. Nearly every week, a consultant from Tuft's University works directly in the classroom with teachers to help teachers improve teaching and learning.

On those workshop days when your child has no school, teachers are busy perfecting their teaching skills. The first two workshop days are focusing on writing effective lesson plans using higher order thinking, connecting assessments to instruction and how to differentiate instruction. The SAU also provides workshops on various topics that are aimed at improving instruction. Faculty meetings are held twice a month with further instruction and/or practice in an area aimed at improving instruction.

When you come to the High School for Parent Conferences ask about your child's progress and also ask about how and what they are learning in the classroom. You will see exciting things happening in education.

News from the Darryl J. Rice Memorial Media Center:

In support of our Literacy goal, a book group has formed which meets during Block 3. The group's first selection is *The Lovely Bones* by Alice Sebold. In addition, high school students are reading and rating this year's Flume Award selections, which is a N.H. Teen Readers' Choice Award. A wiki has also been created to have online discussion and book reviews.

Teen Read Week was held Oct. 12-18. Find out what your teen is reading in school and for personal enjoyment. Earlier this month, we raised awareness with a display of 'challenged' titles during Banned Books Week.

Last spring, we were awarded a grant through the National Endowment for the Humanities called "Picturing America". We toured their museum that really consists of their Main Street. Seven buildings (1903 - 1925) have been preserved with prehistoric to homestead era displays. Their main street is gravel with wooden sidewalks and hitching posts.

I can't begin to tell you how nice and friendly the people are of our namesake town. They welcomed us with "open arms" and made our stay truly memorable.

The town was founded by two homesteaders in 1905, at a siding on the "Great Northern Railroad". When they petitioned the U.S Postal Service for a Post Office they were given a list of names. Epping was one of the names and they thought it was unusual and there was only the one other one, in New Hampshire. (We were named for Epping Woods in England, home of Lord Baden Powell, the founder of the Boy Scouts. There is one other Epping, in Australia.)

When we arrived home in August, we were contacted by the Union Leader and the Exeter Newsletter for details of our visit. Little did we know our "summer adventure" would continue into the fall!!




