Mid August has arrived and summer is all too soon beginning to become the threshold for Fall. As a result, we are already looking to some of the needs and concerns that many in and around our community have. Those needs involve warm outerwear, food on the shelf, a warm meal, and someone to check on us just to know we are safe.

The Word of God says, "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me' (Matthew 25:35-36).

Following this Biblical word, we would like to take this opportunity to speak once more about three programs that are available without cost to those in our community who find themselves in a time of need or in need of the services we offer.

The <u>FOOD PANTRY</u> is open two times weekly, January through December. Canned goods, bakery items, sundries, meats, and other staples are often available through the pantry. We realize that every want may not be met. But the FOOD PANTRY attempts to be a transitional help and temporary assistance to those for whom the FOOD PANTRY plays an important part in meeting the nutritional needs.

Another program begun this year is our <u>TELEPHONE CARE</u> program. The design of the program is to provide a daily contact for those who find it comforting to know that once in the morning Monday through Friday an individual from the church will call to check and see that things are okay and the day has started.

Earlier this year we had an individual who did not answer the phone when one of our volunteers called. We sent an individual to check and see that things were okay. It is a kind of "friendly safety net" that many find helpful. Whether for an aging parent, a home alone elder, a shut-in or any other need, TELEPHONE CARE provides comfort and assurance knowing that someone is calling to be sure *you* are okay. This program is provided all year long. If you are interested in having TELEPHONE CARE for yourself or someone you love call 679-5542 and leave your name and telephone number where we may call you and talk further. There is no cost or fee associated with this program.

THIRD SATURDAY DINNERS continue each month with serving from 5 to 7 p.m. The cost is \$8.00 and all proceeds benefit the Building Fund. On September 19th, the dinner is baked ham, mashed potatoes, green bean casserole, dessert and beverage. On October 17th, dinner will be roast turkey with stuffing, mashed potatoes, squash, peas, corn bread, pumpkin and apple pies and beverage.

News from the Historical Society

-Submitted by Madelyn Williamson During World War II, Norman St. Laurent of Epping survived a 70 mile a day death march from the Philippines to Manchuria where he died in a Japanese Prisoner of War camp on Dec 28, 1942.

His mess kit and dog tags, hidden by his fellow POWs, were returned by them to his parents and family here where they remain treasured mementos.

The town named St. Laurent Street in honor of this fallen soldier and the large framed American flag dedicated to Norman was presented by his family and is now prominently displayed in our Town Hall meeting room.

On Aug 8th, 67 years after Norman's death, his family and friends gathered once again for Norman, this time to accept the Purple Heart on his behalf at a memorable ceremony held at the N.H. State Veterans Cemetery in Boscawen.

We honor Norman and All Who Serve.

Your town library has been a busy place this summer and is gearing up for a fall season full of activities for all ages. As households shift back into the school year routine, we'd like to remind everyone to check and make sure you have returned library materials that were borrowed during the summer months. We know many families don't have the same luxury of visiting the library weekly once sports and homework kick in, but if you check for library books now, you won't have to search later when you get a call from us wondering where they are. The library doesn't charge fines for over dues, but instead utilizes a Conscience Jar system, which allows each patron to donate what seems appropriate to alleviate the guilt of returning books and movies that others may be waiting for. Funds collected are used to purchase replacement copies of items that never find their way back. There are currently over 500 patrons with items that are overdue from one day to as much as a year or more. Remember, books may be checked out for 2 weeks and movies go out for only 1 week. You can renew items over the phone if no one else is waiting for the title. Please check your bookshelves at home so we don't have to use up staff time to make those awkward reminder phone calls.

Those of you who visit the library in the evenings may have noticed we have a new evening staff member. After sifting through dozens of applications, our director Bradley Green hired Epping resident Debbie Allen to start in August. She will be at the main desk from 5 to 8 on weekdays. Please stop in and introduce yourself! We are currently looking for a new student assistant to work with Deb since our much-loved Rebecca has left to attend Unity College in Maine. The student needs to be 16 years of age to work the weeknight shift in the children's room from 5 to 8. We hope to fill this position shortly after school starts in September, and may hire 2 students to share the 5 night-a-week schedule. Interested students are invited to stop by the library during the day for a job description and an application.

The library is open Monday through Friday from 10 am to 8 pm and Saturdays from 10 to 2 pm. Coming Up in September and October:

as Moms and Dads. Once the grown-ups are done at the school, however, there's often an empty house to go back to until school lets out. For those of you who are not quite ready for that level of quiet, Miss Tracie is offering an alternative. On Tuesday, September 8th, after EES's First Day come to the library at 10:00 for coffee, snacks and "girl time". We can share first day jitters stories, compare notes, eat chocolate and keep the tissues handy. We may even decide to run a funny movie to alleviate any remaining stress. With no other programs planned for that day, Moms (and Dads too, if they want) are welcome to stay until they feel ready to take on the rest of the day! Our library family has become a great support system for us all.

Summer Reading Program: What an amazing exploration of ancient Egypt we had this summer! Over 230 children from age 3 to 13 participated, reading a total of 116,695 minutes. Just as much fun as the projects and games were the kids who staffed the program. We couldn't have done it without such a great group of people!

Before and After School Programs

Our before-school program offers a valuable service to families of children at the elementary school level. The program is held inside the Epping Elementary School building, and it allows working parents to drop off their children early on all school days. Our staff offers casual homework help, board games, movies, gym activities, and an escort to the school's healthy breakfast program. The families we serve appreciate the safe and comfortable environment that we provide during the beforeschool hours. In 2008, we moved this program's opening time from 7 a.m. to 6:45 a.m. in response to parent demand. We expect an average of 25 children per day to participate in this program over the coming school year.

After school, we offer both a middle school and an elementary school program, each with a variety of age-appropriate enrichment activities, as well as plenty of supervised free time for small group play and relaxation. Both programs are open from the time the school bell rings until 5:30 p.m. on all school days, and both include supervised pickup

from all after-school clubs and activities held at the schools. This year we expect an average of 50 children per day to enroll in our after-school programs.

Registration is now open! Space is limited. Sign up for five, four, three or two days per week for both programs.
