Special School District Meeting for Teachers' Agreement

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE - There will be a Budget Committee Public Hearing at 7:00 pm on Thursday, April 29, 2010 in the Epping Town Hall to present and discuss the Teachers' Agreement that will be acted upon at the Deliberative Session on May 25, 2010 and voted on June 22, 2010.

SPECIAL SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING - At the March, 2010 Annual Meeting the voters approved a special school district meeting if the Teachers' Agreement did not pass. The agreement did not pass and the school district will be holding a Special School District Meeting to act and vote upon a renegotiated Teachers' Agreement. The School Board and Teachers' Association

renegotiated the agreement with the goal of reducing cost.

First year has been reduced to <u>no cost</u>. Teachers will receive 0% cost of living raise and no experience steps.

Second year has not changed. Teachers will receive 1% cost of living raise and experience steps. As before the salary schedule has been changed to reduce step increases from an average of 3.49% to 3.05%. It is important to note that 50% of teachers do not receive experience steps. More information will be posted.

The Civil War Roundtable of NH

The month of April was important for the civil war, here are some dates and events

- 1. April 12 & 13 1861, Fort Sumter in Charleston, South Carolina is fired upon by Confederate forces. Some 30 hours later the fort surrenders to Confederate forces and the Union garrison evacuates the fort. (1 Union soldier dies from a misfired cannon).
- 2. In 1865, the Civil War ends with General Lee's forces surrounded on April 7th. General Grant and Lee met and talked surrender terms on April 9th. This ends a conflict that costs the lives of approximately 600,000 Americans.
- 3. President Lincoln led the nation during America's bloodiest war. he was shot by John Wilkes Booth in Ford Theater on April 14, dying from his wound on the morning of April 15, 1865.

On May 14th, (note 2nd Friday), we will have Historian/Author Michael Kauffman talk about Lucy Hale a daughter of a New Hampshire Senator and her relationship with John Wilkes Booth.

On June 18th, Mr. Dick Simpson of our CWRT will speak about Pea Ridge. This battle took place March 7-8, 1862, in NW Arkansas. Come and listen and learn of this battle between Union and Confederate forces where the Union Army was outnumbered.

During the 2009 calendar year, the food pantry program servied over 1500 families and individuals. A very special "thank you" to those who join us in caring for others.

The <u>FOOD PANTRY</u> is open two times weekly, January through December. Canned goods, bakery items, sundries, meats, and other staples are often available through the pantry. We realize that every want may not be met. But the FOOD PANTRY attempts to be a transitional help and temporary assistance to those for whom the FOOD PANTRY plays an important part in meeting their nutritional needs.

West Epping Dam to be Removed

The NH State Dept of Environmental Services (DES) will be removing the Bunker Pond Dam in West Epping. A sediment sampling is scheduled and investigation of the wells in the area and the impact that a lower water level might have on them. There will also be a cultural resource review of the site to determine the level of documentation needed. The Epping Historical Society has formally requested that archeological study be conducted of the site, that the area be restored for public recreation and that a historical marker be erected to honor this spot where Joshua Folsom built the first dam in 1746 and the beginning of the West Epping community.

There will be another public informational meeting to update the progress with the project and share some of the information that has been gathered. Town All abutters and the have notified that plans for removal of the dam are moving forward.
