Programs for Children

Splash Into Summer! Epping's Summer Reading Program

Once again, Epping Elementary School Librarians Barbara Young and Maryanne Nicosia will be coming down the hill to run the summer reading program at HMML. This year they will help kids ages 5 - 11 "Make a Special Splash" as they spend 6 weeks exploring the subjects EES students know as "specials". Reading logs are available for independent readers as well as children who are being read to. For every 30 minutes read, children will earn \$1.00 in 'splash cash' to spend in the SRP Store and get a ticket to work on an amazing assortment of projects and challenges in art, music, health, computer and reading. A roll of the dice will determine which topic the child will focus on for that visit. At the end of the program all the projects will be compiled into a Summer Splash Scrapbook to be taken home. This is a drop-in program running June 28th through August 5th Monday through Thursday from 10 to 2 and Wednesday evenings from 5 to 8. Families are invited to stop in anytime during these hours to participate. We welcome Epping teens Colin Nollet and Tess Kucera to our summer reading staff this year after their many summers of volunteering.

In addition readers of all ages may participate in our "Splashing Around Epping" scavenger hunt. Once 30 minutes has been logged, readers are eligible to make their own stamp book and stamp. Each visit to the library yields a clue that will lead to a place of interest in Epping. Each location will host a "letterbox" with a stamp, inkpad and booklet. Upon discovering the clue's ending location, readers will use their personal stamp to mark the host book then use the host stamp to mark their own book. Each week there will be a different letter hidden among the locations. By summer's end those having found S-P-L-A-S-H will be entered in a drawing for special prizes.

While "Make a Special Splash" ends after the annual Barbeque and play by the UNH Theater Troupe "Little Red Wagon" on August 4th, the SRP store and the scavenger hunt will continue until August 21st.

Preschool Storyhour: During the 6 weeks of Summer Reading our Storyhour moves to its summer schedule. From June 30th to August 5th we will meet on Wednesdays @ 9:15 and Thursdays @ 9:15 and 2:30. This is a drop-in program designed for children ages 2 to 6 that will follow the

Splash theme with a focus letter and age appropriate activities each week. The kids have a little time to explore the library, look for books and play with friends before sitting down for songs and stories with Miss Tracie, and then may participate in the related craft project. Older preschoolers may enjoy the projects in the "Make a Special Splash" program and are welcome to participate especially if they have older siblings. Preschoolers can fill out a "Read to Me" reading log to earn splash cash just like the big kids to spend in the SRP store.

Pajama Night: This summer we will have just one Pajama Night on Friday, July 9th, but we will make up for the Princess Tea that never happened in May. This will be a special dress-up event for all princes and princesses, complete with stories, projects and a dazzling scavenger hunt Fancy Nancy would be proud of!

School Board also recommends that a policy examination be performed within 12 months of starting grade 6 and grade 9. A physical examination must be performed within 12 months of the athletic sport date. Student athletes continuing to participate in the athletic program must be re-examined within two years of the previous physical examination on file. example, if an exam was performed September 2008, another exam would be required by September 2010 to continue athletic eligibility. (Policy JLCA and JLCB can be referenced on the district website at www.sau14.org under school board and policy.)





